The history of the tricolor flag dates back to 1054 A.D. in Ancient Ghana. The colors of the flag are the oldest colors in the world. The black represents African Blacks, the red represents the blood shed in the defense of their land, the green represents the great Green Savannah which was the Sahara before it became a desert.

Charter Members Marcus Garvey introduced the tricolor flag in ANTHONY BALDAROTTAthe U.S. in the 1920's. He emblazoned the words "One God, One Aim, One Destiny". It has served as ALEX BOYD MRS.
