The Glass Menagerie

The Glass Menagerie, a memory play by Tennessee Williams, is concerned with three people and the effect a gentleman caller makes upon their lives.

First, there is Amanda, a faded Southern belle, who cannot face the grim reality of her present drab situation in life. She tries to relive her gay youth through her daughter, Laura. However, Laura is a crippled, sensitive, painfully shy girl, whose only happiness comes from withdrawing into her protected dream world of little glass animals. Tom, her brother, remains with his family only out of pity for Laura's plight, for he is frequently involved in bitter arguments with his mother.

Hope flashes through the family when Tom brings home a young man to dinner. Amanda, ecstatically pictures him as the long-awaited gentleman caller for her daughter. Through his outgoing, brash manner, the young man awakens in Laura a happiness and enthusiasm for life, only to tell her that he is engaged to be married. This disappointment leaves Amanda bitterly disillusioned and Laura quietly sinks back into her realm of little glass animals, having once more found reality too painful.

Diversified Occupations is cooperative part-time vocational training. The D.O. co-ordinator interviews and counsels students regarding the results of preference and aptitude tests. Then placement is made with a carefully selected co-operator in industry who trains the student on the job for a minimum of three hours per day. The student also receives related instruction in classroom work for one hour each day. This allows the student-learner to receive training for a skilled trade before leaving high school. He also receives a beginner's wage when he starts his training, and upon completion of training, receives his regular graduation diploma from high school.

Christmas they help needy families.



The year concluded with the A Cappella Choir singing for baccalaureate.


