## F.F.A.

Future Farmers of America is an organization for boys interested in farming and vocational agriculture in high school. In addition to carrying out experiments on special plots of land, the boys raise crops and livestock for projects and various contests held during the year. The boys belong to the Champaign F.F.A. Chapter whose sponsor is Mr. J. Arthur Twardock.

## D.O.

Diversified Occupations is cooperative, part-time vocational training open only to juniors and seniors. After taking preference and aptitude tests, the applicants are interviewed and counseled by a D.O. Coordinator. Then the students are carefully placed in jobs according to the results of the tests for a minimum of three hours a day. Each student also receives one hour of related classroom instruction daily. Until completion of training, students are paid beginner's wages. Mr. McAllister is in charge of the organization.


## CHORAL GROUPS



Whether the Tigers won or lost, any team that took them on this year knew that they had been in a ball game. The Tigers compiled a 3-5-1 record and the respect of all opponents for hard-hitting and a never-give-up spirit. As defending Big 12 champions, the Tigers were the prime target for all foes and came through admirably. Urbana beat Stephen Decatur, Georgetown, and Danville Schlarman and were barely topped by conference champion Mattoon and arch-rival Champaign.

Against Decatur, the Tigers parlayed a fine running attack and 148 aerial yards by quarterback Buddy Hult into a 20-13 win. Mattoon beat Urbana in the final minute on a pass interception that was run back by the Green Wave for a touchdown.




## FOOTBALL

## SOPHOMORE FOOTBALL





The Tiger cagers' 15-10 record was one of the finest in Urbana basketball history and their second-place finish in the Big 12 was the highest for UHS in 22 years. Highlights of the year were wins over Decatur, Springfield and Champaign. This year's victories marked the first time Urbana had beaten Decatur on the Reds' floor in 20 years; the 53-46 victory over CHS was the first win in 13 consecutive games, and the Solon loss was Springfield's first conference defeat of the year. The only other teams to beat Springfield were Clinton and Thornton of Har-

vey in the State quarter-finals. Head coach Oscar Adams awarded leters to 13 cagers, among them cocaptains Gary Storm and Steve Shoemaker. Shoemaker's 17.3 points per game is the highest average for a player in Urbana's history. Next year's cocaptains Jim Booth and Bob Mock will join one other returning letterman. Bob Richardson and Storm shared the George Widing free throw award with identical .802 percentages. It was Richardson's second award in as many years.

Injuries plagued the Tiger grapplers throughout the 1960-61 season, but nevertheless, Urbana captured the district crown and second places in both conference and sectional meets. Captain Tom Tinkham headed the list of six returning lettermen that presented a fine nucleus for coach Bob Raudonis. Six front-line wrestlers, half of the entire team, were injured at crucial points in the season. Tinkham, Bill Marshall, Terry Thomas, and Tom Bebout were injured just prior to the post-season tournaments; Bebout suffered a broken leg on the eve of the state meet. Tigers Phil Thrasher, Jim Karlberg, Bebout, and captain-elect Ron Pryor all qualified for the state meet, and Pryor advanced to the semi-finals. At season's end, Bill Thrasher was voted Most Valuable Wrestler; Bebout was voted Most Improved; and Wally Rogers received the award for most pins. UHS ended the season undefeated in dual meets and will return 11 of 17 lettermen next year.


