Education at Urbana High can be comprehensive. In addition to, or as part of, the traditional program, students may elect workstudy classes or participate in a senior elective internship program which places students in jobs or professions for part or all of the school day. PUPS, a unique stu-dent, parent and young child program, brings parents and their children into the school. A Nurse's Assistant program allows students the opportunity to train to be a licensed assistant by the end of a high school career. Housing construction classes give students a chance to learn all phases of building from the planning to the interior finish. Other programs such as Sea Explorers prepare students for summer and vacation experiences with environmental studies. Independent studies provide for individual exploration in study areas. A class in stage lighting gives drama students a look at the theater scene from a technical point of view. A Principal's Scholar Program offers incentive to achieve. Learning at this school can be a full experience.



This win, along with the defeat of Centennial, established Urbana as 1983's Twin City Champions. The Tigers finished 6 and 3 overall, the best record in four years. M.V.P. Randy Hoggard had the third best season's rushing record in the school's history with 1,092 yards and became an All-Stater.
